Effective February 22, 2018, all residents are required to obtain a permit from the Fire Department to set off Fireworks within the Municipality.

Township of Matachewan Municipal Election for Council and Mayor

As you may be aware, 2018 is an election year for the Township of Matachewan. As with any election there are strict time lines and dates that must be followed. Here are dates to keep in mind with regards to the nomination period and voting day.

- Tuesday, May 1, 2018 at 9:00 am, the Nomination Period Opens.
- Friday, July 27, 2018 at 2:00 pm, the Nomination Period is Closed.
- Monday, July 30, 2018, Certification of nomination papers to be completed by
 4:00pm.
- Advanced Voting Day is Saturday, October 13, 2018 from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm.
- Voting Day is Monday, October 22, 2018 from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm
- Monday, December 3, 2018 Term of Office commences.

Voting will take place at the **Matachewan Recreation Hall** at 285 Moyneur Ave.

Nomination Procedures:

- Every person who proposes to be a candidate must file nomination papers prior to receiving
 any campaign contributions. Prospective candidates are NOT required to provide 25
 endorsement signatures with their nomination papers.
- Nomination Papers will be available from the Clerk at the Municipal Office located at
 283 Moyneur Ave. or on the municipal website, www.matachewan.com
- All nomination forms must be completed in person at the Clerks Office, 283 Moyneur Ave,
 Matachewan.
- Candidates are required to complete the Nomination Paper, which includes a declaration of qualification, taken before a Commissioner of Oaths. All candidates must provide photo identification containing the candidates signature.
- Nominations must be accompanied by the prescribed nomination filing fee,
- Filling fee for the Position of Mayor is \$200.00
- Filling fee for a Position on Council is \$100.00
- The filling fees can be paid by cash, certified cheque or money order payable to the Township of Matachewan.

Township of Matachewan Municipal Election for Council and Mayor

If an agent is filing the nomination on behalf of a candidate, the Candidate 's Nomination paper must be commissioned before the agent files the nomination form with the Town. The agent must provide a copy of the Candidate 's identification as well as providing their own identification. Candidates are responsible for ensuring that they meet all the qualifications and have followed the procedures with respect to the filing of Nomination Papers.

Qualifications of Candidates:

In order to run for office in the Township of Matachewan, a person must be:

- A) A Canadian Citizen;
- B) At least 18 years of age;
- C) A resident of Matachewan, or the owner or tenant of land here, or the spouse of such owner or tenant of land;
- D) Who is not disqualified by any legislation from holding office.

Ineligibility:

The following are ineligible to be elected as members of Council:

- A) An employee of the Township of Matachewan except during an authorized leave of absence (the leave of absence must begin upon filing the Nomination Form).
- B) A person who is not an employee of the municipality but who is the clerk, treasurer, Integrity Commissioner, Auditor General, Ombudsman or registrar, or who holds any administrative position of the municipality.
- C) A judge of any court.
- D) A member of the Assembly as provided in the *Legislative Assembly Act* or of the Senate or House of Commons of Canada.

CAMPING SWIMMING AND BOATING SAFETY

BE PREPARED!

Always prepare for the unexpected. Before you leave, check the weather report, learn about security at your camp location, and tell family and friends your plans. Know what to do when toilets are not available. Be sure to bring along a supply kit that includes a first-aid kit, compass or GPS, map, flashlight, blankets, batteries, food, water, clothes, and medications. Know who to contact at the camp to report issues that may come up. When you return home, check for ticks, skin rashes or sunburn, dehydration, and other problems.

Avoid wild animals, and protect family pets

Some wild animals carry diseases that are dangerous to people. Avoid touching, feeding, and getting near wild animals. Enjoy watching them from a safe distance in their natural surroundings. Keep foods stored in sealed containers and out of the reach of animals. Make sure your family pets are vaccinated and always keep a close eye on them. Check for ticks, and remove them promptly.



Fight the bug bite

Mosquitoes, ticks, and other insects can cause certain diseases. To help fight the bite, apply insect repellent containing DEET to exposed skin. Be sure to follow directions on the package. Check for ticks daily, and remove them promptly. Wear long sleeves, pants, and other light-colored clothing to help prevent and spot ticks more easily.



Prevent heat stroke

To help prevent heat-related illness during hot days, drink plenty of alcohol-free and sugar-free fluids. Don't wait until you're thirsty to drink. Wear layers of light-weight, light-colored, and loose-fitting clothing. Rest often in shady areas. Protect yourself from too much sun.

Protect yourself from the sun

Protection from ultraviolet (UV) radiation is important all year. UV rays from the sun can reach you on cloudy and hazy days, as well as bright and sunny days. Use a broad-spectrum (against UVA and UVB rays) sunscreen and lipscreen with at least SPF 15. Seek shade, especially during midday hours, when the sun's rays are strongest. Cover up with clothing, a wide-brimmed hat, and sunglasses.


Swimming

Take a shower before and after swimming. Never swim alone. If you plan to ride in a boat, canoe, or other water vehicle, be sure to wear a life jacket.

Boating

Do I Need A Boating Licence In Canada?

YES! Excluding the Northwest Territories or Nunavut, all persons who operate a recreational motorized pleasure craft in Canada must carry a Transport Canada Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC) commonly referred to as a boating license or equivalent proof of competency on board. The draw for the 2018 Can-Am Defender 570 with Winch and Can-Am Trailer will follow. (Tickets sold separately)


- -Please adhere to all regulations and laws pertaining to fishing and boating safety

Fun facts: The Maple Leaf was first used as a 'national' symbol in Can you name all the Provinces and Territories? 1868 when it appeared on the coat of arms of both Ontario and Quebec. The maple leaf was later added to the Canadian coat of arms in 1921. The maple leaf became a symbol of Canada's nationality and independence by removing the association with the British Union Jack on the old flag.
